HIGHLAND COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS: June 6, 2022 Meeting

- 1. Heard a report on a check-in meeting with five of the seven ministry team leaders. The renewed structure has enriched the ministry of Highland Church. A few areas for continued development include scheduling team meetings for each ministry, strengthening the connection with each council liaison, and spurring Highland people to show up faithfully when they are scheduled to serve.
- 2. Heard with concern that by the end of May we are \$22,000 behind in our budget giving. That is \$16,000 behind where we stood last year at this time.
- 3. Heard with joy that the Youth Director Search Team has identified a promising prospect who has shown significant interest in ministry with our youth.
- 4. Approved a recommendation from the Pastor Search Team to invite a Pastor of interest and his wife to come for a weekend, contingent on a few steps, like checking references.
